All students who attend the Opportunity Center receive:


- Personalized graduation plan (HS Only)

THE HAZELWOOD SUCCESS ACADEMY (HSA)



HSA is a full day alternative education program designed for high school students in the Hazelwood School District, who seek academic, social and personal growth in a small personal learning environment, and/or are having difficulty in the traditional school setting.

HSA PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



- Nine Certified Teachers: Two English, Two Math, Two Social Studies, Two Edgenuity, One Science
- Three Certified Support Staff: Two Counselors and Two Social Workers
- Students receive instruction from certified classroom teachers while completing elective courses via Edgenuity (online program)

SUCCESS ACADEMY (HSA)





ALTERNATIVE SUPPORT CENTER (ASC)



ASC is a full day alternative education program designed for students in 6th- 8th grade, in the Hazelwood School District, who need academic, social and personal growth in a small personal learning environment due to being assigned a long-term suspension.


ASC PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



- Nine Certified Teachers: Two English, Two Math,
 Two Social Studies, Two Edgenuity, One Science
- Four Certified Support Staff: Two Counselors and Two Social Workers
- Students receive instruction from certified classroom teachers while completing elective courses via
 Edgenuity (online program)

ALTERNATIVE SUPPORT CENTER (ASC)





MISSOURI OPTION PROGRAM (MO OPTION)



The Missouri Option program is for students aged 17 or older entering their fourth year of high school with a credit deficiency or who have other demonstrated needs.

Students attend this program to earn a high school diploma by achieving a passing score on the HiSet Exam (formerly the GED Test). Graduates develop and pursue post-secondary plans.

MISSOURI OPTION PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



- One certified teacher work with students. Instruction is a combination of on-line and teacher directed.
- There are fifteen students in each three-hour session for a total enrollment of 30 students
- Students receive a Hazelwood School District diploma upon completion of all graduation requirements and passing all five parts of the HiSet exam


MISSOURI OPTION PROGRAM DESCRIPTION




- Students' complete community service hours, and/or are employed during non-direct instructional sessions
- It is recommended that students score at least at the 8th grade level in reading and mathematics on the test for The Adult Basic Education (TABE) assessment to enter the program

MISSOURI OPTION PROGRAM (MO OPTION)











PROJECT RESTART (PR)

Half day program designed to serve high school students in need of an alternative setting to assist them in getting on track to meet the requirements for graduation by developing and implementing a tailored plan for earning their high school diploma and pursuing their post-secondary goals.





Project Restart addresses the needs of students:

- Flexible scheduling opportunities
- Teen parenting
- Employment conflicts
- Students who have transferred into the district in their third or fourth year of high school and have a credit deficiency
- Chronic absenteeism

PR PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



- Three certified teachers working with students to prepare them to be successful
- A combination of online and teacher directed instruction is tailored to meet the needs of each student's path to graduation
- There are two three-hour sessions. Total enrollment of 90 students

PR PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



- Teachers help students learn to pace themselves appropriately to complete their coursework independently
- A Special School District staff member provides support to students as required
- The Adult Basic Education (TABE) test is used to help staff create a support plan as needed.

POSITIVE CHOICE (PC)



Any student who has received a long-term suspension as a result of a disciplinary hearing has the voluntary option of attending the Positive Choice Program.

High school students have the opportunity of earning credits. Middle school students may attend the program under extenuating circumstances. Middle school students will work toward fulfilling requirements for promotion.

The student returns to their home school at the end of their suspension. Grades earned are placed on the transcript and forwarded to the home school.

PC Program Description



- There are three certified teachers working with students to prepare them to be successful
- There are two three-hour sessions. Total enrollment of 90 students
- Teachers help students learn to pace themselves appropriately to complete their coursework.
- A Special School District staff member provides support to students as required

STUDENT REFOCUS PROGRAM (SRP)



The Student Refocus Program is for middle and high school students to address chronic behaviors and be more preventative and intentional in providing support to correct those behaviors.

Each student receives targeted support in their area of specific need from the counselor of the program with the goal of them returning to their home school between 6 - 12 weeks.

STUDENT REFOCUS PROGRAM (SRP)



Criterion/considerations for assignment to the program include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Number of discipline referrals
- Exhaustion of school-based interventions
- Chronic or excessive absence issues
- Other factors deemed detrimental to the student or others in the school community

SRP Program Description



- Three certified teachers (one high school and two middle school) working with students to prepare them be successful
- Each classroom has a maximum of fifteen (15) students. This number is designed to provide students with a high degree of one-on-one support
- Online instruction will take place tailored to meet the needs of each student

SRP Program Description



- Weekly communication with parent/guardian
- Students will participate in: Free reading time, daily journals, and writing essays, group and individual counseling sessions
- A Special School District staff member and will provide support to students as required

SHORT TERM SUSPENSION (STS)



Any middle or high school student who has been assigned an out of school suspension for 5 - 10 days has the opportunity to attend the Short-Term Suspension Program.

In this program students spend the school day with staff, who will assist them in completing their assignments and assure that they are on track when they return to their home school.

Students' assignments are provided by the referring school.

STS Program Description




- Two staff members works with students to prepare them be successful
- Full Day Sessions
- Students may also participate in group and individual counseling sessions to assist them in making better choices and decrease the likelihood of them being suspended in the future
- Transportation must be provided by parents

Finish Line Program (FLP)




Program for high school students to improve student achievement, differentiate and expand resources and services for students, and support the district's graduation rate. Students will complete all graduation requirements to earn a Hazelwood diploma.

The Finish Line Program addresses the needs of students:

- 4th and 5th year Seniors
- Seniors with an interest and desire to graduate high school
- Seniors who have obtained a minimum of 15 credits

FLP Program Description



- One certified teacher works with students to prepare them graduate
- Two three-hour sessions. Total enrollment of 30 students.
- Students should maintain 85% or higher attendance rate
- Create a post-secondary academic and employment goals
- Take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) and ACT WorkKeys Assessments
- Complete graduation requirements within maximum of two semesters
- Complete academic intervention projects to address skill deficiency


