

What is Project Restart?

Project Restart is a half-day program designed to serve high school students in need of an alternative setting to assist them in getting on track to meet the requirements for graduation. The staff of the program will assist students in developing and implementing, a tailored plan for earning their high school diploma and pursuing their post-secondary goals. Students with the following needs are eligible to attend:

- Disciplinary or academic issues
- Chronically truant or absent to school
- Have minimal credits and have low or no chance to graduate with their class
- Teen parenting, employment conflicts, or other demonstrated needs

How do I apply?

Below is the process for enrollment in Project Restart:

- The building principal will identify students
 who may benefit from enrollment in Project
 Restart. The principal and counselor will
 meet with the student/parent to discuss the
 program. If the parent wants to enroll the
 student, the administrator/counselor will
 assist the parent in completing the application.
- The principal will then forward all information to the appropriate HOC staff as well as the Director of Alternative Education.
 The parent/guardian will then be called to arrange a time for an intake meeting at the Hazelwood Opportunity Center.
- During the intake meeting, staff members will share a Path to Graduation form with the student. Paths to graduation could follow one of the four options below after a designated period of time of being enrolled in Project Restart:
 - Referral to the Hazelwood Success Academy
 - Referral to the Missouri Option Program
 - 3. Referral to the Finish Line Program
 - 4. Referral to other educational program(s) in the St. Louis area
- After the intake meeting the student will be enrolled in the program within 48 hours and begin their path to graduation.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Where is Project Restart located?

A: The Hazelwood Opportunity Center at 1865 Dunn Road, St. Louis, Mo. 63138.

Q: What are the hours of Project Restart?

A: There are two (2), three (3) hour sessions: the first session is from 7:30 - 10:30 am and the second session is from 11:00 am - 1:40 pm.

Q. How many students are in the program?

A. There is a maximum of ninety (90) students enrolled - forty-five (45) students may be enrolled in each session.

Q: Is transportation provided?

A: Yes. Limited transportation is provided. Bus routes will be discussed during the student intake meeting.

Q: What kind of diploma will the student earn?

A: The goal is for all students to earn a Hazelwood School District diploma.
